IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using your telephone equipment, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and injury to persons, including the following:

- 1. Read and understand all instructions.
- Follow all warnings and instructions marked on the product.
- Unplug this product from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners. Use a damp cloth for cleaning.
- Do not use this product near water, for example, near a bathtub, wash bowl, kitchen sink, or laundry tub, in a wet basement or near a swimming pool.





REMOVE – Press to delete the displayed entry. When the telephone is idle, press and hold to remove all call history entries.

Options – Press to display the menu. When in the menu, press to save your setting and advance to the next feature setting.

DIRECTORY– Press to enter the directory or when in directory exit and return to idle mode.

PROG – Press to save numbers in emergency buttons.

REDIAL – Press to redial the last number dialed. When the telephone is idle, press and hold to delete the last number dialed.

FLASH –During a call, press to receive an incoming call if you subscribe to the call waiting service from your telephone service provider.

MUTE – Press to mute the handset or speakerphone microphone; press again to resume conversation.

▲ CALL LIST ▼ – Press to review call history records or scroll through options when in the feature menu.

DISPLAY DIAL – Press to dial the display number.

CLEAR – Press to return to idle mode.

SPEAKER – Press to turn the base speakerphone on or off.

▲ VOLUME ▼ – Press to adjust the speakerphone or handset listening volume.

CALL INFO

- On when the line is in use.
- Flashes quickly when there is an incoming call.

TELEPHONE UNIT:

FLASH Button - Momentarily hangs up the phone to access custom calling features such as Call Waiting or Three-Way Calling provided by your local phone company.

LCD BACKLIGHT AND LIGHTED

KEY PAD – The LCD and keypad illuminates making for easy dialing even in a darkened room.

Handset Retainer Tab - If you decide to have the unit placed in the wall mount position, the handset retainer tab can be pulled out and turned around so that it allows the handset to hang onto the base unit.

RINGER ON/OFF Switch - Used to turn the ringer volume ON or OFF.

Hook switch - A switch on the handset cradle of the base unit, which is used to hang up or get a dial tone.

Off -Hook Indication -

The LCD panel will display the Off-Hook icon " on the first line of the LCD panel to indicate that the handset is Off - Hook.

One-Touch Memory Buttons - The Big Button Plus 20270 can store up to 3 emergency telephone numbers into memory (up to 16 digits each), and you can then dial any of the stored phone numbers by just pressing one of the emergency buttons located above the LCD panel.

REDIAL Button - This button allows you to automatically dials the last phone number dialed up to 32 digits.


SPEAKERPHONE Button - Allows you to place and receive calls without having to use the handset.

VOLUME Control - Used to adjust the volume of the speaker when using the speakerphone.

Visual Ring Indicator - flashes to alert a person who has trouble hearing that the phone is ringing.

BATTERY INSTALLATION

Your unit requires 4 "AA" batteries (not included). alkaline batteries are recommended. The battery compartment is located in the bottom of the base unit. Carefully remove the battery cover and follow the markings in the compartment as shown below:


Desktop Use

- Set the unit on the selected desktop and connect the telephone line cord to the telephone line jack on the rear of the base unit.
- Connect the opposite end of telephone line cord to the telephone modular wall jack.
- Connect one end of the coiled handset cord to the handset jack of the base unit (located on the left hand side of the base) and the other end to the handset jack of the handset.

Wall Use

(with a standard AT&T or GTE modular wall jack)


- 1. Connect the short telephone line cord to the telephone line jack on rear of the base unit.
- 2. Connect the opposite end of the short telephone line cord to the telephone modular wall jack.
- 3. Align the wall mounting slots with the studs located on the modular wall plate and slide the base down to lock in place. See figure 1.



NOTE: If you do not have a standard modular wall jack, have a qualified technician mount one on the wall.

Handset Retainer Tab Installation

If the base unit is to be placed in the wall mount position, the handset retainer tab must be pulled out, turned around and placed in the opposite direction, so that the tab allows the handset to hang onto the base unit, as shown in figure 2



OPTIONAL AC ADAPTOR

AC Adaptor (not included) with a rating of 120VAC input, DC6V, 100 mA output with a center tip that is negative. The adaptor plug must correctly fit the machine's DC jack.

- 1. Plug the AC Adaptor into a standard AC outlet.
- 2. Insert the small plug into the DC jack on the rear of the base.

NOTE: If you wish to order the optional AC Adaptor, an Accessory Order Form has provided with this unit.

TELEPHONE SETTINGS

The screen will display prompts to help you set up the telephone when you first install it. You can always get back to these setup screens by pressing **OPTIONS**.

NOTE: You can exit feature setup at any time by pressing **CLEAR** or by lifting the handset when there is no incoming call.

Language selection

You can select **ENGLISH**, **ESPANOL**(Spanish) or **FRANCAIS** (French) as the language in which your screen prompts are displayed. When you first install batteries, the screen displays:

- Press CALL LIST▲ or CALL LIST▼ until the screen displays your language selection.
- 2. Press **OPTIONS** to save your setting, and move to the next option.

Set contrast

Adjust screen brightness to a comfortable level, from 1 (light) to 4 (dark).

1. Press **OPTIONS** repeatedly until the screen displays:

 until the screen displays
 the contrast level you prefer.

3. Press **OPTIONS** to save the setting, and move to the next option.

Set home area code

You must program your area code, so your telephone can properly recognize and dial calls.

- 3. Press **OPTIONS** to save the setting. You will see the local area code setup screen.

NOTE: A home area code must be programmed to use the display dial feature. If you try to use **DISPLAY DIAL** before entering a home area code, you will be prompted to enter the home area code. Enter the code and press **OPTIONS.**

Set local area code

You can program up to four local area codes.

1. Press OPTIONS repeatedly until the screen displays:

- 3. When the correct time and date (month-year) are shown, press **OPTIONS** to save the new setting and move to the next option.

Set remaining features

You can customize how the features of this product work.

Telephone operation

Make a call

1. Lift the handset, then enter the telephone number.

-OR

Press **SPEAKER** on the telephone base, then enter the telephone number.

To end the call, hang up.

-OR-

Press SPEAKER.

Answer a call

• Lift the handset.

-OR-

Press **SPEAKER**.

NOTE: The **CALL INFO** indicator flashes quickly to show that the telephone is ringing.

Switch between handset and speakerphone

While on a handset call, press

SPEAKER and replace the handset in the telephone base.

While on a speakerphonecall, lift the

Handset or speakerphone volume

Press **VOLUME** ▲ or **VOLUME** ▼ to adjust the volume of what you hear while on a call.

Redial

The last number called from this telephone (up to 32 digits) is stored in redial memory.

1. Lift the handset.

-OR-

Press SPEAKER.

2. Press **REDIAL**. The number is dialed automatically.

NOTE: When the telephone is idle, press and hold **REDIAL** to delete the last number dialed. **DELETED** displays.

Chain dialing

Chain dialing is useful if you need to access numbers other than telephone numbers (such as bank account numbers or access codes) from the directory, speed dial locations or call history.

- 1. Lift the handset or press **SPEAKER**.
- 2. Wait for a dial tone. Dial the first number. You can do this manually, from the directory or the call history.
- 3. To dial a number (up to 48 digits): **From the directory:**
 - a. Press **DIRECTORY.**
 - b. Press CALL LIST

 or
 CALL LIST

 to scroll to
 REVIEW. Press OPTIONS.

 - d. Press **DISPLAY DIAL**. The telephone will automatically dial the displayed number.

From the call history:

- a. Press CALL LIST
 or
 CALL LIST
 to scroll to
 the desired entry.
- Press **DISPLAY DIAL**. The telephone will automatically dial the displayed number.

Flash/ call waiting

If you subscribe to call waiting service with your telephone service provide, you can answer a new incoming call without losing your current call.

- While on a call, press FLASH to connect to the new call when you receive a call waiting signal.
- 2. Press **FLASH** again to return to the original call.

NOTES:

- Use FLASH to access other subscriber services, as described by your telephone service provider.
- The telephone cannot display the caller ID information if another telephone on the same line is in use.

Make sure all extensions are not in use.

Mute

Press **MUTE** to prevent the other party from hearing you. You will still be able to hear the other party. Press **MUTE** again to return to your two-way conversation.

Ringer switch

Use the ringer switch on the base to adjust the ringer **ON** or **OFF**. If the ringer switch is set to **OFF**, this telephone will not ring when there is an incoming call. However, the **CALL INFO** indicator will still flash to indicate an incoming call.

Call info

The **CALL INFO** indicator on the telephone is used to indicate there is additional information in the display about the current or previous calls.

Directory operation

Directory memory capacity

This telephone has a directory where you can store up to 25 additional telephone numbers and names. Numbers can be up to 24 digits long and names can be up to 15 characters.

Directory entries are stored in alphabetical order. You may wish to enter names with the last name first to maintain consistency with information stored through the caller ID features of this telephone.

Press **CLEAR** at any time to exit the directory without saving changes and return to the idle screen.

NOTE: Entries cannot be edited after the screen displays **STORED**.

Store numbers and names in the directory

- 2. Press **OPTIONS** and the screen displays **ENTER NUMBER**
- 3. Enter the telephone number (up to 24 digits) you want to store. Press CALL LIST ▲ to backspace and make corrections

-OR-

Press **REDIAL** to store the last number dialed (up to 24 digits).

- 4. Press **OPTIONS**, and the screen displays **ENTER NAME**.
- 5. Press CALL LIST to backspace and CALL LIST to advance or add a space. When you want to enter two character in a row that share a dial pad key (for example M and O), you must press CALL LIST to move the cursor to the next position. The screen automatically returns to idle mode if you do not press a dial pad key within 15 seconds.
- 6. Press **OPTIONS** to store the name and number.

NOTE: If the number you entered is over 24 digits, the screen displays **ONLY 24 ALLOWED.**

Store a pause or a flash in a directory number

Press CALL LIST ▼ twice to store a pause in the dialing sequence (P displays). Press FLASH to store a flash in the dialing sequence for some special services (F displays).

NOTE: To exit the directory at any time without saving changes, press **CLEAR**.

Store a call history number in the directory

- Press CALL LIST▲ or CALL LIST▼ to scroll through the call history.
- 2. Press **DIRECTORY** to store the displayed call information in the

telephone directory. The screen displays **STORED**.

NOTE: Call information is stored exactly as it appears in the call history.

Review directory entries

- Press DIRECTORY. Then press CALL LIST ▲ or CALL LIST ▼ to scroll to REVIEW.
- 2. Press **OPTIONS**, and the screen displays the first entry in the directory.
- 3. Press CALL LIST ▲ or CALL LIST ▼ to scroll through an alphabetical list of names stored in the telephone directory.

-OR-

Use the dial pad keys to enter the first character of the name you want to view, then press **CALL** ▼ **LIST** if needed to move to the desired name.

Press **DIRECTORY** or **CLEAR** to exit

Dial a directory number

- Follow the instructions in Review directory entries above to find the number you want to call.
- When the entry you want is displayed, press **DISPLAY DIAL** to make the call. The speakerphone is activated.

-OR-

Press **DISPLAY DIAL**, then lift the handset to make the call.

Delete a directory entry

- Follow the instructions in Review directory entries above to find the number you want to delete.
- 2. When the number is displayed, press **REMOVE** to delete the entry.

Caller ID operation **Information about call history**

If you subscribe to caller ID service with your telephone service provider, this

telephone stores all incoming calls with valid caller ID information in the call history. Name, number, time and date can all be stored, if they are sent with the call. A call is assigned a number from 1 to 65. The most recent call will have the highest number. The call history number appears next to the telephone number on the display. New (missed) call information shows **NEW** in the display. A repeat call from the same number shows **REP** in the display.

If you answer a call before information appears on the screen, it will not be stored in the call history. Between the first and the second rings, the screen displays:

- The caller's name (up to 15 letters are sent by your telephone service provider)
- The caller's area code and telephone number (area code is not displayed if it is programmed as the home area code).
- The time and date of the call.
- The caller's position in the call history, which is displayed to the left of the telephone number.

Call information is displayed for about 15 seconds.

NOTES:

- If you press REMOVE while the telephone is ringing, or while you are on a call, the call information will not be stored in the call history.
- If you are using the display for setup or to review entries stored in the memory and a call comes in, press **CLEAR** while the telephone is ringing to see the information. If you are setting up the telephone, press **OPTIONS** first to save the setup information. Even if the call information is not displayed, it will be stored in the call history.

Caller ID

You can customize how the caller ID features of this product work. See **Set remaining features** on pag 9 for instructions. For options, see **REPEATED CALLS** and **CALL LIST ORDER** in the **Feature summary** on page 10.

Review call history

- When the telephone is idle, press
 CALL LIST

 or CALL LIST

 to enter the call history.
- 2. If you select NEW CALL FIRST in CALL LIST ORDER (see Feature summary on page 10), press CALL LIST ▲ repeatedly to show the new calls. Once the new calls have been reviewed, all caller ID entries are shown starting with the most recent call.

-ORIf you select BY TIME in CALL
LIST ORDER (see Feature
summary on page 10), the screen
shows the caller ID entries starting
with the most recent call. Press
CALL LIST▲ or CALL LIST▼
to scroll through the caller ID

3. Press **CLEAR** to exit and return to idle mode.

- 3. Press **DISPLAY DIAL**. The screen shows the number being called and the call is dialed automatically. If the screen displays **ERROR PRESENT** or **NO NUMBER**, The present number cannot be dialed.

NOTE: You cannot use this feature to dial **PRIVATE** or **UNKNOWN** numbers.

Display options

If the number displayed in the call history needs to hace a 1 or the area code added or removed, you can do that. When the number you wish to call is displayed, press **OPTIONS** and then press **CALL LIST** or **CALL LIST** to scroll through the dialing format choices.

The various dialing options are: 888-722-7702 1-722-7702

722-7702 1888-7227702

The specific dialing options available for each call history record depends on the format of the original call.

To Program the 3 Emergency Numbers

- 1. Press and release the **emergency numbers button**.
- 2. Enter the number to be stored. (The telephone number will not dial out.)
- Press and release the emergency numbers button again.
- 4. Press the corresponding emergency buttons for each of the emergency numbers you wish to store:







(Fire)

(Hospital)

(Police)

NOTE: If the line power is lost for a few hours, phone numbers stored in MEMORY are not lost. The Big Button Plus 20270 will retain the programmed numbers.

IMPORTANT: When programming emergency numbers and/or making test calls to emergency numbers:

- Remain on the line and briefly explain to the dispatcher the reason for the call before hanging up.
- Perform such activities during offpeak hours such as early morning or late evening.

To Dial an Emergency Number

- 1. Lift the handset and listen for a dial tone.
- Press the desired button. The number stored in that button's memory location will be dialed.

Store a call history number in emergency numbers

- Press CALL LIST▲ or CALL LIST ▼ to scroll through the call history.
 Press PROG, then press a emergency numbers to store the number. The screen displays STORED.

The Caller ID LCD panel does not show the caller's name and/or phone number	 The Caller ID unit will not function until you have Caller ID service provided by your local phone company. Call your local phone company to have Caller ID installed on your telephone line. Check your telephone line connections. Refer to the section "INSTALLATION" of the manual for details. If you picked up the phone before the second ring, the caller information will not be correctly received. If you have a telephone answering device (TAD) connected with the unit, set the TAD to answer after two rings or more. If it is a blocked call or an out-of-area call, the caller's name and/or phone number will not appear on the display. Please refer to the "Receiving Caller ID Information" section of the user's manual for more details.

No dial tone	 The handset cord or telephone line cord may be loose at the connections. Push in firmly at both ends to establish good contacts. Test the phone at a different telephone wall jack and listen for a dial tone. Test a different phone in the wall jack and listen for a dial tone. 	
Will not ring	 Check the RINGER ON/OFF switch. It may be in the OFF position. The phone or another phone connected to the same line may be in the off-hook (in-use) position. Place the phone in the on-hook (hung-up) position to receive incoming calls. Try a different phone; if the problem still exists, the fault is not with the unit. Look for the Ringer Equivalence Number (REN) number Printed underneath your phone(s). Sum up the total REN numbers for all the phones or answering machines connected to your telephone line. Your phone(s) may not ring if the REN total exceeds five (5). Please call your local company to determine the maximum REN for your calling area. 	
Static	 Try a different phone; if the problem still exists, the fault is not with the unit. Some atmospheric conditions such as very low humidity can cause static build-up. 	
Cannot dial out	 Try a different phone in the jack. If the problem persists, the fault is not in the Big Button Plus 20270. Is the phone connected to an answering machine? Disconnect the answering machine and try to have the phone plugged into the jack alone. If it works alone, there is a compatibility problem. Purchase a 2 for 1 adaptor at any phone or electrical supply store. Plug the 2 for 1 adaptor into the modular wall jack, then plug the phone into one side and the answering machine on the other side of the adaptor. 	



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
